Where should you start?



1 Assign licenses of the Adobe apps to your users.

Faculty and staff

All faculty and staff in the FTE submitted count should be added as users in the Adobe Admin Console so they can have access to Adobe apps and services via named user licensing. For more information on how to access the Admin Console, [click here](#).

What if I'm unable to access the Console?

Contact your institution's Console System Admin to request access.

Labs and libraries

All lab and library machines should be deployed with a serial number. Serial numbers update with a new enterprise agreement. Therefore, make sure you update lab machines with the latest serial number as soon as possible to avoid any interruption in service that may accompany past serial numbers. You may access your latest serial numbers at <https://licensing.adobe.com>.
